Preamble

Section 2108(a) and Section 2108(e) of the Social Security Act (the Act) provide that each state and territory* must assess the operation of its state child health plan in each federal fiscal year and report to the Secretary, by January 1 following the end of the federal fiscal year, on the results of the assessment. In addition, this section of the Act provides that the state must assess the progress made in reducing the number of uncovered, low-income children. The state is out of compliance with CHIP statute and regulations if the report is not submitted by January 1. The state is also out of compliance if any section of this report relevant to the state's program is incomplete.

The framework is designed to:

- Build on data already collected by CMS quarterly enrollment and expenditure reports, AND

I. Explanation of Progress:

1. What other strategies does your state use to measure and report on access to, quality, or outcomes of care received by your CHIP population? What have you found? [7500] Contracted MCOs are required to be accredited by NCQA. All plans have quality improvement programs, disease management, and provider relations operations. The MCOs are encouraged to perform all HEDIS measures for the Medicaid product as part of their QI program; the MCOs are also required to meet HEDIS specifications for data collection. Required HEDIS measures include: (1) Childhood Immunization Status, (2) Lead Screening in Children, (3) Breast Cancer Screening, (4) Timeliness of Prenatal Care, (5) Postpartum Care, (6) Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months of Life, (7) Well-Child Visits in the Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Year of Life, (8) Adolescent Well-Care Visit, (9) Comprehensive Diabetes Care, (10) Asthma – Medication Management, (11) Cholesterol Management, (12) Control of High Blood Pressure, (13) Antidepressant Medication Management, (14) Follow-up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness, (15) Follow-up Care for Children Prescribed ADHD Medication, (16) Cervical Cancer Screening. (17) Medical Assistance with Smoking and Tobacco Use Cessation, (18) Use of First Line Psychosocial Care for Children and Adolescents on Antipsychotics, (19) Adults' Access to Preventative/Ambulatory Health Services, and (20) Children and Adolescents' Access to Primary Care Practitioners. All studies combine CHIP and Medicaid population data. DMAS has created a Quality Collaborative in which the contracted MCOs share their challenges and successes in quality measurement and improvement. Rates of immunization and well-child/adolescent visits have generally exceeded the national HEDIS 50th percentile.

Virginia's Medicaid Managed Care Quality Initiative also assures compliance with federal mandates for external quality review organization (EQRO) activities, including (1) validation of a sample of each MCO's performance measures annually, (2) implementation of an 18-month rapid cycle performance improvement project related to diabetes care, and (3) comprehensive review of MCO compliance with federal and state operational standards once every three years. The contracted EQRO conducts these activities using CMS published protocols.

Finally, the Children's Health Insurance Program Advisory Committee (CHIPAC) monitors the FAMIS program data related to enrollment, access, utilization, and retention, and continues to be actively interested in improving utilization of preventive services.

2. What strategies does your CHIP program have for future measurement and reporting on access to, quality, or outcomes of care received by your CHIP population? When will data be available? [7500]

The agency contracts for a comprehensive birth outcomes study that looks at timeliness and adequacy of prenatal care, birth weight, and gestational age for the FAMIS Moms and Medicaid populations. The current study added measures to look beyond immediate birth outcomes aimed at assessing newborn care after discharge. This includes:

- The percentage of newborns receiving at least two visits with a primary care provider (PCP) in the 30 days following birth. Supplemental analyses identified the percentage of newborns receiving (1) zero visits in the 30 days following birth, and (2) one visit in the 30 days following birth.
- The percentage of newborns who had at least one emergency department (ED) visit in the 30 days following birth. Supplemental analyses identified the range in the number of ED visits reported within the 30 day period.

The results of the 2016 study are currently available for public review.

3. Have you conducted any focused quality studies on your CHIP population, e.g., adolescents, attention deficit disorder, substance abuse, special heath care needs or other emerging health care needs? What have you found? [7500]

The birth outcomes study referenced above is a focused study that addresses women served by the FAMIS Moms program and their infants (who at birth are deemed eligible for FAMIS or Medicaid, as applicable). Previous years' analyses have demonstrated that women who participate in the FAMIS MOMS program have birth outcomes (e.g., rates of preterm and low birth weight births) better than those of the general population.

[7500] The 2015 Birth Outcomes and CHIP CAHPS Reports are attached. The Agency has completed Program Year 1 (2016) of the Pay for Performance (PFP) initiative with the contracted MCOs. Results of HEDIS 2016 measures for immunization rates and prenatal care were factored into the PFP. The Program Year 1 PFP results indicated that four MCOs were assessed for awards and two MCOs were assessed for penalties for their performance in 2016. PFP results for 2017 are not yet available.

Section IIIA: Outreach

1. How have you redirected/changed your outreach strategies during the reporting period? [7500]

Between October 2016 and September 2017, five Community Outreach Coordinators were on the Outreach and Consumer Communications staff. Three were regional positions covering the Far Southwest, Roanoke/Alleghany, and Northern Virginia. The other two positions were centrally located in Richmond and also covered Tidewater as well as statewide outreach. Using their unique knowledge of their respective localities, staff increased outreach through community and employer presentations, attendance at workshops, enhancing community partnerships, health fair attendance, and materials distribution.

There was some staff turnover: the full-time statewide Outreach Coordinator position was refilled in October 2016 (after being vacated in June); the centrally located Marketing and Outreach Coordinator position was not filled (after it was vacated in September); the Northern Virginia Community Outreach Coordinator left in December 2016 and a suitable replacement was not found. A new bilingual Community Outreach Coordinator was hired in the Tidewater region in May 2017. The bilingual Community Outreach Coordinator who had been serving Central Virginia and Tidewater became the primary Latino Outreach position that also served to cover statewide outreach to Spanish-speaking populations as requested.

In addition to staff changes, the Marketing and Outreach Department also went through considerable change as the Marketing and Enrollment Services (MES) Division Director left in September 2016 and the MES Division was dismantled. In January 2017, what had been the Marketing and Outreach Department in MES was transitioned into the Office of Communications, Legislation and Administration (OCLA). The department is now the Outreach and Consumer Communications Unit. The staff continues to provide outreach for CHIP programs.

In FFY 2017, the Cover Virginia website (www.coverva.org) continued support of the Federal Health Insurance Marketplace in Virginia during Open Enrollment and beyond. All of the Marketplace materials also supported enrollment in Virginia's FAMIS program. FAMIS has been actively promoted on the Cover Virginia and FAMIS Facebook pages and through the Cover Virginia Twitter account. We continued to distribute the FAMIS flyer in English and Spanish as well as the updated FAMIS brochure in English and Spanish. This brochure provides comprehensive information about the program and has been widely used by DMAS and community partners to promote FAMIS statewide.

As specified in the Governor's Healthy Virginia Plan, in FFY 2017 we continued to administer a second contract with the Virginia Health Care Foundation for additional Project Connect grantees providing application assistance for children's Medicaid and FAMIS in areas of high need. This

contract included five outreach worker positions strategically placed around the state. That second contract ended at the end of SFY 2017, on June 30, 2017.

The Governor's Healthy Virginia Plan, originating in 2014, also extended funding in FFY 2017 for continuation of a contract with a public relations firm to conduct a media advertising campaign through the end of the state fiscal year. Outreach and Consumer Communications staff worked with the ad company to continue the "Parenting Challenges" ad campaign to include a cold and flu season (January/February) and spring (May/June) media buy. The campaigns included TV, radio, digital, and Hispanic newspaper ads. This contract also ended on June 30, 2017, and no further media advertising is planned.

Staff also managed the 16th annual FAMIS Back-to-School campaign in August and September 2017. In September 2017, the Outreach and Consumer Communications unit organized an event at Richmond Children's Hospital at VCU to celebrate reaching the Governor's Healthy Virginia goal of enrolling an additional 35,000 children in FAMIS and Medicaid since September 2014. Governor McAuliffe attended and spoke about the importance of the program as well as the need for timely reauthorization of the CHIP program. Local dignitaries also attended and the event drew local media coverage.

2. What methods have you found most effective in reaching low-income, uninsured children (e.g., T.V., school outreach, word-of-mouth)? How have you measured effectiveness? **[7500]**

For sixteen years, the most effective outreach strategy employed by DMAS has always been the annual FAMIS Back-To-School (BTS) campaign. This year, for the third time, we increased our outreach through distribution of more than 1.5 million flyers to every public school in the state (1,800-plus, including elementary, middle, and high schools), and in coordination with the Free and Reduced School Lunch Program. This campaign has gained statewide name recognition. Also as part of this campaign, through a direct partnership with Arlington Public Schools, we have for several years provided BTS flyers directly to the school district to be inserted in first-day-of-school packets – thereby guaranteeing 100 percent participation from this school district.

Another proven outreach strategy is a media campaign schedule that includes TV, radio, digital, and Hispanic newspapers. This year, we benefited from an advertising campaign that ran during the cold and flu season (January/February) and spring (April/May), but that had ended by Backto-School (August/September).

In previous years, we measured our success through increased call and application volume as well as through a short applicant survey. Since changes were implemented in 2014 to the way Virginians apply for FAMIS, we no longer have the ability to track all applications received or have access to an applicant survey. In FFY 2015, we assessed that visits to the Cover Virginia website in September 2015 increased 41% compared to the average for the year.

However, for FFY 2016, the benefits of a first full year of media advertising skewed this measure during the 2016 Back-to-School campaign, as there was a marked increase in website visits during all three media campaigns. In FFY 2017, this measurement would be further skewed because the media advertising only ran for part of the year, through June. There was no media advertising during the Back-to-School campaign.

DMAS began tracking the number of direct visits to the FAMIS page on the Cover Virginia website in June 2015. In FFY 2017, the monthly average number of visits to the FAMIS page was 13,271. The number of visits to the FAMIS page showed the highest increases in October 2016 (52%), and, for 2017, in January (81%), February (58%), and May (16%). These months either coincided with or were just after one of the media campaigns.

	We consider our partnership with the Virginia Department of Education and our work with local school systems a best practice. Our most successful strategies tap into the existing relationships that schools, and specifically school nurses, have with families and children. These relationships provide opportunities to share information about our programs.
	We would also consider our ongoing relationship with Arlington Public Schools a best practice.
	We consider regular media advertising a best practice that yields results, but the funding source is not secure enough to be able to build on it from one year to the next.

	Have these efforts been successful, and how have you measured effectiveness? [7500] We offer our print materials in Spanish and some other FAMIS informational materials in 15 languages. The Cover Virginia website was also available during FFY 2017 in 48 languages as a translation through Google Translate. We ran more Spanish radio advertising during the year and sponsored a weekly interview on Spanish radio in Central Virginia.
	During FFY 2017, the percentage of children covered by our separate CHIP program who reported as Spanish speakers averaged 10 percent. This number has decreased by two percentage points over the last year, despite the active efforts of bilingual outreach staff in Latino communities, especially in Central Virginia.
	Two Community Outreach Coordinators also conducted rural outreach throughout the Far Southwest counties of Virginia during FFY 2017, targeting the uninsured through grassroots outreach in churches, schools, employers, and with other local organizations.

Section V: Program Challenges and Accomplishments

1. For the reporting period, please provide an overview of your state's political and fiscal environment as it relates to health care for low income, uninsured children and families, and how this environment impacted CHIP. [7500]

The current administration has made increasing health coverage of uninsured children a priority. The Governor's "A Healthy Virginia" campaign has significantly boosted children's enrollment in Virginia's CHIP and Medicaid programs.

The 2017 General Assembly session again saw proposals to expand Medicaid coverage to previously ineligible adults. Medicaid expansion would extend health care coverage to additional Virginia parents, and parental coverage has been shown to improve children's access to care as well. Currently, Virginia's Medicaid income ceiling for parents is below 50 percent of the federal policy level (the cutoff income varies by region), but with Medicaid expansion it would increase to match that of other categorically eligible groups. Medicaid expansion proposals put forward in the 2017 General Assembly session did not gain traction. The Governor has stated that he intends to include Medicaid expansion in his outgoing budget.

Virginia held elections for its House of Delegates in November 2017. As of the writing of this report, the outcome of several elections were contested and pending recounts. It is not known at this time which party will be the majority party in the state's lower house in the upcoming legislative session. Regardless of the partisan balance of power, the issue of Medicaid expansion is a high priority for many incoming legislators. Expansion proposals are likely to be actively debated and receive serious attention in the 2018 General Assembly session.

2. During the reporting period, what has been the greatest challenge your program has experienced? [7500]

The primary challenge for Virginia's CHIP program is an uncertain future. The Commonwealth will run out of federal CHIP funds at the end of January 2018 if Congress fails to act. DMAS is currently in the process of contingency planning for the possibility that federal CHIP funding will not be renewed and Virginia will be forced to end its FAMIS and FAMIS MOMS programs.

In early December, DMAS sent letters to the families of the nearly 68,000 children and more than 1,000 pregnant women affected, notifying them that their coverage will end if Congress does not act. Despite concerns that the notification could cause unnecessary panic or undermine participants' confidence in the program, DMAS decided further delay was not possible. Families must have adequate notice of the possibility their children's coverage will end so they can factor this knowledge into critical medical decisions and begin to consider what options they may have for alternate coverage.

Efforts are now underway to train eligibility workers, application assistors, call center staff, local departments of social services, and others to advise participants as they receive termination letters. In the coming weeks, the Department will continue to prepare for the possible end of the FAMIS programs. DMAS will need to notify providers and modify information technology systems. Contracts for managed care and other services will need to be amended.

If FAMIS coverage is terminated, even temporarily, families will suffer negative consequences. Some children and pregnant women could opt to enroll in employer-sponsored health care plans or plans on the federal health care exchange. However, many families would face much higher out-of-pocket costs that could cause them to lose coverage, and not all families would qualify.

In addition, if federal funding is not reauthorized, the requirement to continue coverage of the estimated 60,000 children in the CHIP Medicaid expansion group will cause considerable strain on the state budget. DMAS estimates that the drop in the federal funding match, from the enhanced rate of 88 percent to the Medicaid rate of 50 percent, would result in \$34.7 million in additional general fund costs in SFY 2018, rising to \$79.0 million in SFY 2019.

3. During the reporting period, what accomplishments have been achieved in your program? [7500] In September 2014, the Governor launched a campaign to enroll an additional 35,000 children in CHIP and Medicaid as part of his "A Healthy Virginia" initiative. On September 1, 2017, DMAS exceeded that goal, for a total of 38,365 newly enrolled children. DMAS' most recent numbers from December 1, 2017 reflect the addition of 48,437 children newly insured through FAMIS and FAMIS Plus, the state's CHIP and Medicaid programs – a 40 percent increase over the original goal. Advertising and outreach campaigns to promote FAMIS were successful and well-received statewide. Building outreach and marketing focused on the Spanish-speaking population has been an important addition to DMAS' work.

The July 2016 addition of coverage for behavioral therapy services, including but not limited to applied behavior analysis, has been a significant accomplishment. Virginia has a commercial insurance mandate for these services, which have also been covered under Medicaid; the CHIP-enrolled population was therefore an isolated group of children who could not access these critical services until this change was made by the General Assembly.

Maintaining the Cover Virginia Call Center and CPU, along with the enhanced Cover Virginia website, has ensured that families receive efficient and effective customer service. Operationally, efforts have

been made to further align managed care contracts for Medicaid and CHIP services, and compliance oversight of managed care contractors has been enhanced. These accomplishments reflect more efficient use of available resources.

4. What changes have you made or are planning to make in your CHIP program during the next fiscal year? Please comment on why the changes are planned. **[7500]**

In response to the national and state opioid crisis, the Commonwealth is expanding services for substance use treatment across the Medicaid and CHIP populations. This includes enhanced access to outpatient services (e.g., partial hospitalization, medication-assisted treatment) and peer supports. This represents a significant improvement in both the scope of treatment options and access to such services. Implementing the CMS Medicaid and CHIP Managed Care Final Rule is a high priority as new managed care contracts are finalized.

DMAS is also in the process of contingency planning for the possibility that federal CHIP funding will not be renewed and Virginia will be forced to end the FAMIS program. Please see Response #2 for further information.
