Dear Ms. Arnold:

We are pleased to inform you that your title XXI Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) State plan amendment (SPA) #11 submitted on May 14, 2007, with additional information and revised State plan pages submitted on July 2, 2007, April 9, 2009, and April 20, 2009, has been approved. This amendment has a retroactive effective date of September 1, 2007.

This SPA eliminates temporary enrollment in CHIP of children who appear to be Medicaideligible at the time of initial application, while their Medicaid eligibility is being determined. However, the State will continue to assist families and facilitate enrollment of their children in Medicaid. The SPA also allows children to remain enrolled in CHIP at the annual redetermination when they appear to be Medicaid eligible until the Medicaid eligibility determination is completed and the child is enrolled in Medicaid. This provision will ensure continuity of care for children during the transition between programs.
