Dear Ms. Mohr-Peterson:

We are informing you that your Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) State Plan Amendment (SPA) #11, submitted August 27, 2009, with additional information submitted December 22, 2009, August 25, 2010, and September 2, 2010, has been approved.

This amendment allows Oregon to expand coverage to unborn children with family income up to 185 percent of the Federal poverty level (FPL) in Benton, Clackamas, Hood River, Jackson and Lincoln counties.

This SPA has a retroactive effective date of October 1, 2009 for Benton, Clackamas, Hood River, and Jackson counties. The State covered the unborn in Lincoln County only from October 1, 2009 to December 31, 2009 due to budget constraints.
