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- 7. Nonprescription drugs. (Restricted to select Acne Preparations, Analgesics, Antidiarrheals/Antacids, Antiemetics, Antihistamines, Cough & Cold, Electrolytes, Emollients, GI Stimulants/Antiflatulents, Insulin, Minerals, Nicotine Replacement Therapy, NSAIDs, Ophthalmics, Respiratory Inhalants, Topical Antibiotics, Topical Antifungals, Topical Keratolytics, Topical Pediculicides, Vaginal Antifungals, Vitamins, and nonprescription drugs previously covered as prescription drugs)
- 8. Covered outpatient drugs, which the manufacturer seeks to require as a condition of sale that associated tests or monitoring services be purchased exclusively from the manufacturer or his designee. (Excluded)
- 9. Drugs prescribed in Section 107(c)(3) of the Drug Amendments of 1962 and identical, similar, or related drugs (within the meaning of Section 310.6(b)(1) of Title 21 of the Code of Federal Regulations (DESI drugs).
- 10. Barbiturates.
- 11. Benzodiazepines.
- 12. Vaccines available through the Vaccines for Children program. (Excluded)
- 13. Agents when used for the treatment of sexual or erectile dysfunction, unless such agents are used to treat a condition, other than sexual or erectile dysfunction, for which the agents have been approved by the Food and Drug Administration. (Excluded)

Drugs or classes of drugs not designated above as excluded or restricted are provided to all Medicaid recipients, including any "part D eligible individual" (as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 1395w-101(a)(3)(A)). Restrictions applied to drugs or classes of drugs designated above as excluded or restricted are the same for all Medicaid recipients including any "part D eligible individual" (as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 1395w-101(a)(3)(A)).

- D. Effective January 1, 2006, the Medicaid agency will not cover any "covered part D drugs" (as defined by 42 U.S.C. § 1395w-102(e)(1)-(2)) for any "part D eligible individual" (as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 1395w-101(a)(3)(A)), including such individuals not enrolled in a Medicare part D plan.

SUPPLEMENTAL MEDICAID REBATE AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Section 1927 of the Act, the state has the following policies for supplemental rebates for Medicaid.

- A. CMS has authorized the state of Iowa to enter into "The Sovereign States Drug Consortium (SSDC)." A model rebate agreement between the state and a drug manufacturer for drugs provided to the Medicaid population, submitted to CMS on April 28, 2010, and entitled "SSDC Iowa Medicaid Supplemental Drug Rebate Agreement" has been authorized by CMS.
