Dear Mr. Lynch:

On October 16, 2015, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) received Nebraska's State Plan Amendment (SPA) transmittal #15-0008 of Section S25 which proposed to eliminate the requirement that the dependent child must be deprived of parental support or care as a requirement of eligibility for the Parent/Caretaker Relative group; to use 58% of the FPL as the income limit for this group rather than the fixed dollar amounts previously used; and clarified the language for caretaker relative. This SPA replaces the S25 as last approved with SPA #15-0009.

SPA #15-0008 was approved on November 10, 2015, as shown in MMDL with an effective date of November 1, 2015 as requested. Enclosed is a copy of the CMS-179 summary form, as well as the approved S25 for incorporation into the Nebraska State Plan.
