ALTERNATE CONTACT FOR OPERATIONAL QUESTIONS

Many of you may remember the Drug Rebate Hotline that was in operation until a few years ago. Although we are not reestablishing the hotline, we have acquired the time and knowledge of one of the people who used to man the hotline. Aaron Allen is once again assuming, albeit on a part time basis, some of the drug rebate operational functions.

UPDATING T-BILL RATES

We receive many phone calls each week asking for the current week's t-bill rate. To help cut down on the volume of calls for this information while still enabling you to get the rate quickly, we suggest that you consider making use of your local Federal Reserve Bank. By dialing your local Federal Reserve Bank you can obtain the current week's 90-day (13 week) t-bill rate.

T-bill rates for prior weeks can be found on HCFA's drug rebate web site. The website is updated on a monthly basis. In addition, the HCFA releases contain an updated list of t-bill rates as current as possible and dating back approximately 9-12 months depending on the date of the release.

Please remember that t-bill rates are needed ONLY when you are preparing to cut a check/make a credit for the resolution of a dispute, or payment of an invoice more than 37 days old.

TRAINING GUIDE UPDATES

Attached are the latest updates to the Medicaid Drug Rebate Operational Training Guide. These updates incorporate general revisions, post move address changes, and staff directory changes. Please share the updates with all staff involved in the program and replace these pages in your guide.

RETIREMENT OF AL BEACHLEY

PROBLEMS WITH SEVERAL HOFFMANN-LA ROCHE PRODUCTS

In 1993, the Drug Rebate Program converted Unit Types to meet the standards set forth by the National Council for Prescription Drug Programs (NCPDP). Information regarding this conversion was conveyed to all drug labelers in release # 7 and included the decision to incorporate the Unit Type of "Each" (EA) for powder-filled vials (PFV).

In release # 11, we reported that unit reporting problems were being encountered on invoices containing utilization for PFVs. At that time, therefore, we stated that all PFVs being reported (by states) as "GM" were to be converted to "EA" and utilization was to be corrected accordingly. The lone exception was for NDCs having multiple package sizes where the vials are different sizes. These MUST remain as "GM".

Hoffmann-La Roche has reported that they continue to encounter unit problems quarter after quarter for both Rocephin and Cytovene. Although most invoices indicate the correct Unit Type (EA), the actual units being reported have NOT been converted to reflect this proper Unit Type. In some cases, invoices are still coming in with the incorrect Unit Type of "GM" and in some isolated cases, "MG" is being used. Please peruse your files and convert any and all of the following NDCs to "EA". Please remember to convert units and URA amounts to match.
