# New Child Core Set Measure: Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse or Dependence: Ages 13 to 17 (FUA-CH)

Description	Percentage of emergency department (ED) visits for beneficiaries ages 13 to 17 with a principal diagnosis of alcohol or other drug (AOD) abuse or dependence who had a follow-up visit for AOD abuse or dependence.
Measure Steward	National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)
Data Source	Administrative
Denominator	ED visits for beneficiaries ages 13 to 17 with a principal diagnosis of AOD abuse or dependence on or between January 1 and December 1 of the measurement year.
Numerators	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>30-Day Follow-Up: A follow-up visit with any practitioner, with a principal diagnosis of AOD abuse or dependence within 30 days after the ED visit (31 total days). Include visits that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> <li>7-Day Follow-Up: A follow-up visit with any practitioner, with a principal diagnosis of AOD abuse or dependence within 7 days after the ED visit (8 total days). Include visits that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> </ul>

\*The Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Mental Illness for Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse or Dependence (FUA-AD) measure for age 18 and older was added to the Adult Core Set for FFY 2017, was added to the Health Home Core Set as FUA-HH for age 13 and older for FFY 2020, and has been added to the Child Core Set as FUA-CH for ages 13 to 17 for FFY 2022.



# New Child Core Set Measure: Oral Evaluation, Dental Services (OEV-CH)

Description	Percentage of enrolled children under age 21 who received a comprehensive or periodic oral evaluation within the measurement year.
Measure Steward	American Dental Association on behalf of the Dental Quality Alliance (ADA/DQA)
Data Source	Administrative
Denominator	Children who are under age 21 as of December 31 of the measurement year.
Numerator	The unduplicated number of enrolled children who received an oral evaluation as a dental service during the measurement year.
Other	The measure includes 9 age stratifications and a total rate (<1 to 20).

# New Child Core Set Measure: Topical Fluoride for Children (TFL-CH)

Description	Percentage of enrolled children ages 1 to 20 who received at least two topical fluoride applications as: (1) dental or oral health services, (2) dental services, and (3) oral health services within the measurement year.
Measure Steward	American Dental Association on behalf of the Dental Quality Alliance (ADA/DQA)
Data Source	Administrative
Denominator	Children ages 1 through 20 as of December 31 of the measurement year.
Numerators	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Numerator for Rate 1 (Dental or oral health services): The unduplicated number of enrolled children who received at least two fluoride applications as dental or oral health services during the measurement year, where there were at least two unique dates of service when topical fluoride was provided.</li> <li>• Numerator for Rate 2 (Dental services): The unduplicated number of enrolled children who received at least two fluoride applications as dental services during the measurement year where there were at least two unique dates of service when topical fluoride was provided.</li> </ul>

# New Child Core Set Measure: Topical Fluoride for Children (TFL-CH) (cont.)

Numerators (cont.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Numerator for Rate 3 (Oral health services): The unduplicated number of enrolled children who received at least two fluoride applications as oral health services during the measurement year, where there were at least two unique dates of service when topical fluoride was provided.</li></ul>
Other	The measure includes 8 age stratifications and a total rate (ages 1 to 20).

# New Child/Health Home Core Set Measure: FUM-HH: Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Mental Illness (FUM-CH/HH)

Description	Percentage of emergency department (ED) visits for beneficiaries <sup>a</sup> with a principal diagnosis of mental illness or intentional self-harm and who had a follow-up visit for mental illness.
Measure Steward	National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)
Data Source	Administrative
Denominator	ED visits with a principal diagnosis of mental illness or intentional self harm on or between January 1 and December 1 of the measurement year.
Numerators	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>7 Day Follow-Up: A follow-up visit with any practitioner, with a principal diagnosis of a mental health disorder or with a principal diagnosis of intentional self-harm and any diagnosis of a mental health disorder within 7 days after the ED visit (8 total days). Include visits that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> <li>30 Day Follow-up: A follow-up visit with any practitioner, with a principal diagnosis of a mental health disorder or with a principal diagnosis of intentional self-harm and any diagnosis of mental health disorder within 30 days after the ED visit (31 total days). Include visits that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> </ul>

<sup>a</sup> The Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Mental Illness measure for age 18 and older (FUM-AD) was added to the Adult Core Set for FFY 2017. For FFY 2022 the measure has been added to the Child Core set for beneficiaries ages 6 to 17 (FUM-CH) and has been added to the Health Home Core Set for health home enrollees age 6 and older (FUM-HH).

# New Adult Core Set Measure: Avoidance of Antibiotic Treatment for Acute Bronchitis/Bronchiolitis (AAB-AD)

Description	Percentage of episodes for beneficiaries age 18 and older with a diagnosis of acute bronchitis/bronchiolitis that did not result in an antibiotic dispensing event.
Measure Steward	National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)
Data Source	Administrative
Denominator	Episodes for beneficiaries age 18 and older as of the Episode Date who had an outpatient, telephone, e-visit or virtual check-in, an observation visit, or emergency department visit with a diagnosis of acute bronchitis/bronchiolitis during the intake period.
Numerator	Dispensed a prescription for an antibiotic medication on or three days after the Episode Date.
Calculation	The measure is calculated as an inverted rate $[1 - (\text{numerator}/\text{eligible population})]$ . A higher rate indicates appropriate acute bronchitis/bronchiolitis treatment (i.e., the percentage of episodes that did not result in an antibiotic dispensing event). The rate should be multiplied by 100 and reported as a percentage.

# New Adult/Health Home Core Set Measure: Colorectal Cancer Screening (COL-AD/HH)

Description	Percentage of beneficiaries <sup>a</sup> ages 50 to 75 who had appropriate screening for colorectal cancer.
Measure Steward	National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)
Data Source	Administrative or EHR <sup>b</sup>
Denominator	Beneficiaries ages 51 to 75 as of December 31 of the measurement year.
Numerator	<p>One or more screenings for colorectal cancer. Any of the following meet criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fecal occult blood test (FOBT) during the measurement year. For administrative data, assume the required number of samples were returned, regardless of FOBT type.</li> <li>• Flexible sigmoidoscopy during the measurement year or the four years prior to the measurement year.</li> <li>• Colonoscopy during the measurement year or the nine years prior to the measurement year.</li> <li>• CT colonography during the measurement year or the four years prior to the measurement year.</li> <li>• FIT-DNA test during the measurement year or the two years prior to the measurement year.</li> </ul>

<sup>a</sup> This measure applies to adult Medicaid beneficiaries and health home enrollees ages 50 to 75.

<sup>b</sup> The Colorectal Cancer Screening measure is also specified for Electronic Clinical Data System (ECDS) reporting. ECDS specifications are not currently available for Core Set reporting.

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# FFY 2022 Measure Specification Updates

# Cross-cutting Measure Specification Updates

- Added guidance that states should exclude beneficiaries who die during the measurement year if the state can identify these beneficiaries for the following HEDIS measures:
  - AAB-AD, ADD-CH, AMM-AD, AMR-CH/AD, APM-CH, APP-CH, BCS-AD, CBP-AD/HH, CCS-AD, CHL-CH/AD, CIS-CH, COL-AD/HH, CPA-AD, CPC-CH, FUA-CH/AD/HH, FUH-CH/AD/HH, FUM-CH/AD/HH, FVA-AD, HPC-AD, HPCMI-AD, IET-AD/HH, IMA-CH, MSC-AD, PPC-CH/AD, SAA-AD, SSD-AD, W30-CH, WCC-CH, and WCV-CH.
- Added palliative care as a required exclusion to the following measures:
  - COB-AD, OHD-AD
- Clarified that beneficiaries in hospice should be removed as states determine a measure's eligible population. For hybrid measures, states should remove beneficiaries in hospice prior to drawing the sample.
- Updated guidance related to telehealth:
  - Updated resource summarizing telehealth allowances in all Core Set measures, available at <https://www.medicaid.gov/medicaid/quality-of-care/downloads/telehealth-ta-resource.pdf>.
  - Refer to each measure specification for more information about the type of telehealth that is allowed, and which services can be provided through telehealth.

# Measure-specific Updates: Screening for Depression and Follow-up Plan (CDF-CH/AD/HH)

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- Updated Screening definition to note that the depression screening can be either a clinical or diagnostic tool, and that the depression screening must be reviewed and addressed in the office of the provider on the date of the encounter.
- Updated the Follow-up Plan definition to remove additional evaluation for depression and suicide risk assessment as requirements for documenting follow-up for a positive depression screening.
- Added Guidance for Reporting
  - The intent of the measure is to screen for depression in beneficiaries who have never had a diagnosis of depression or bipolar disorder prior to the eligible encounter used to evaluate the numerator.
  - The measure assesses the most recent depression screening completed either during the eligible encounter or within the 14 days prior to that encounter. Therefore, a clinician would not be able to complete another screening at the time of the encounter to count toward a follow-up, because that would serve as the most recent depression screening. In order to satisfy the follow-up requirement for a beneficiary screening positively, the eligible clinician would need to provide one of the specified follow-up actions, which does not include use of a standardized depression screening tool.
  - Should a beneficiary screen positive for depression, a clinician could opt to complete a suicide risk assessment when appropriate and based on individual beneficiary characteristics. However, for the purposes of this measure, a suicide risk assessment will not qualify as a follow-up plan.



# Measure-specific Updates: Contraceptive Care Measures (CCP-CH/AD, CCW-CH/AD)

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- Removed diaphragm as a moderately effective method of contraception.
- Updated value set directories including:
  - Updated codes indicating a miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy, stillbirth, or induced abortion.
  - Updated codes used to identify provision of a most or moderately effective contraceptive.
  - Updated codes used to identify use of a long-acting reversible contraception method.
  - Updated codes indicating sterilization for non-contraceptive reasons (for CCW-CH/AD).

# Measure-specific Updates: Childhood Immunization Status (CIS-CH)

- Updated measure to remove Combinations 2, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 9.
- The reported rates for FFY 2022 include each of the individual vaccine components shown below as well as Combinations 3, 7, and 10.

# Measure-specific Updates: Developmental Screening in the First Three Years of Life (DEV-CH)

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- Clarified Guidance for Reporting around using modified claims when calculating the numerator:
  - States can explore use of a modifier to indicate that a global developmental screening occurred. For example, Z13.42 can be used to indicate an “Encounter for screening for global developmental delays.”
  - States should exclude a screening with a modifier if the intent of the modifier is to indicate that only a domain-specific screening occurred.
  - Modifiers that indicate that a screening was performed at a certain type of visit can be included.

## Measure-specific Updates: Use of Pharmacotherapy for Opioid Use Disorder (OUD-AD/HH)

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- Updated value set directory to remove NDC codes for Belbuca, Buprenex, Butrans, and their generic equivalents, as these medications are indicated for pain management.

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# Use of Alternate Data Sources for FFY 2022 Core Set Reporting

# Alternate Data Source: LBW-CH and LRCD-CH

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- To reduce state burden and streamline reporting, CMCS will calculate the **Live Births Weighing Less than 2,500 Grams (LBW-CH)** and **Low-Risk Cesarean Delivery (LRCD-CH)** measures for all states for FFY 2022 using natality data submitted by states and compiled by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) in the CDC's Wide-ranging Online Data for Epidemiologic Research (CDC WONDER).
- CMCS will send states a preview of the FFY 2022 LBW-CH and LRCD-CH measures in **spring 2023**, which will be calculated using calendar year 2021 natality data.

# Alternate Data Source: NCIDDS-AD

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- The National Core Indicators (NCI®) Survey (NCIDDS-AD) provides information on beneficiaries' experience and self-reported outcomes of long-term services and supports for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families.
- State agencies voluntarily submit the NCI In-Person Survey results to the NCI National Team using the Online Data Entry System (ODESA).
- State agencies that submit data in ODESA will be invited to approve the sharing of NCI In-Person Survey data with CMCS for the purpose of including it in FFY 2022 Adult Core Set reporting.
- CMCS will send states a preview of the NCI data for FFY 2022 Core Set reporting in **spring 2023**.

# Alternate Data Source: CPC-CH, CPA-AD, FVA-AD, and MSC-AD

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- The Center for Medicaid and CHIP Services (CMCS) is collaborating with the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) to use data from the **AHRQ CAHPS Health Plan Survey Database** to streamline reporting of the CPC-CH, CPA-AD, FVA-AD, and MSC-AD measures.
- All Medicaid and CHIP state agencies and health plans are encouraged to submit CAHPS Health Plan Survey data to the 2022 AHRQ CAHPS Database between **June 6 and July 1, 2022. This includes surveys administered between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022. These data correspond to the FFY 2022 Core Set reporting cycle.**
- CMCS plans to use data from the AHRQ CAHPS Database for public reporting of Core Set measures in future reporting years and is reaching out to states with updates and more information about these plans.
- States and plans that submit their data to the AHRQ CAHPS Database will receive a private, customized Excel feedback report showing their CAHPS survey results compared to overall results in the Database.

# FFY 2022 Data Quality Priorities

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- Documentation of which populations and services are excluded from the measures
  - Programs (Medicaid, CHIP)
  - Delivery systems (managed care, fee-for-service, PCCM)
  - Special populations (for example, dually eligible beneficiaries or individuals in foster care)
  - Health care settings (for example, services provided at federally-qualified health centers, rural health clinics, or Indian Health Service facilities)
- ★ • If your state cannot include some measure-eligible populations, please describe the missing population and the size of the excluded population.
- If there has been a change in the included populations since the previous reporting year, please provide any available context.

# FFY 2022 Data Quality Priorities (cont.)

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- Documentation of how states calculated a state-level rate across multiple reporting units
  - If reporting units used different methodologies (for example, several MCOs used administrative data only and several used the hybrid method), note the number of reporting units using each methodology in the space provided.
  - ★ – Please note whether the state-level rates are weighted by population size and by what weighting factor.
  - Similar guidance applies to creating a health home program-level rate for the Health Home Core Set.
  - Additional guidance on calculating a state-level or health home program-level rate is available at <https://www.medicaid.gov/medicaid/quality-of-care/downloads/state-level-rates-brief.pdf>.

# FFY 2022 Data Quality Priorities (cont.)

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- Alignment between measures included in the Child, Adult, and Health Home Core Sets.
  - Ensure that cross-cutting measures are calculated using consistent methodology.
  - Ensure that cross-cutting measures are reported for all applicable Core Sets.
- Documentation of any deviations from the Core Set specifications, including age groups, data sources, and methods.
- Documentation of any changes in populations, denominators, or rates between reporting years.
  - CMCS recognizes that, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, performance rates may not be comparable to previous years.

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- CMCS will open reporting for the Child, Adult, and Health Home Core Sets for FFY 2021 and FFY 2022 for concurrent reporting in Fall 2022.
  - States will create separate reports for their FFY 2021 and FFY 2022 Core Set data.
  - CMCS will provide more information on reporting in the new web-based reporting system in the coming weeks.
  - CMCS anticipates that Core Set reporting for both FFY 2021 and FFY 2022 will close on December 31, 2022.
- CMCS will host a training webinar in the fall when the web-based reporting system opens for FFY 2021 and FFY 2022 reporting.
